The R.P.D believes in the ability of the young, charismatic, energetic and above all the intelligent to front in the fight for economic freedom while tapping the experience of the elderly in society in our quest to wage war on poverty, corruption, backwardness, diseases, under-development and all other problems confronting Ghana to ensure better lives for Ghanaians from all walks of life.

- j. Ensure shelter for all by instituting better housing policies and schemes in partnership with the private sector.
- k. Reduce the burden of unemployment by instituting policies aimed at training the unemployed to obtain entrepreneurial skills by giving grants and loans to apprentices during and after their training to enable them become self-employed.
- Build a strong economy by reducing government expenditure, Increase revenue mobilization by widening the tax net, encourage local production of goods, checking the flow of imported products into the country, encourage exports and produce most of the consumables we use in this nation ourselves.
- m. Improve upon our infrastructure.
- n. Reform the public sector to weed out corruption, bureaucracy and make it efficient for national development.
- o. Encourage the growth of the private sector and foreign direct investment as well as indigenous investments by making macroeconomic indicators business friendly and also make it reflect in the micro-economy.

Summary

EDUCATION

The reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) shall put in place mechanisms aimed at building a sustainable system of education at all levels to suit the developmental needs of the country. Our main focus shall be on the provision of quality human resource for the nation. We shall revise where possible the current system of education, which is unable to train the

required human resource in terms of quality and quantity for most sectors, deemed very important for national development.

Basic education

The present nature of basic education seems to mostly cater for public basic schools and has little or no bearing on private school as far as the *Free Compulsory Universal Basic Education (FCUBE)* is concerned. This program that is aimed at encouraging more children of school going age to go to school as well as reducing the burden on the parents of these children do not in any way affect children in private schools.

R.P.D shall put mechanisms in place to ensure that children in private schools have the cost of their education reduced in order to bring some kind of relief to their parents and guardians, taking due cognizance of the fact that these children are also Ghanaians and therefore have the right to have a fair share of the national cake.

We shall increase the number of public basic schools in the country as well as improve upon their facilities and the quality of human resource as a way of ensuring that quality education is made accessible to all Ghanaian children.

Secondary education

The party will ensure that all second cycle institutions in the country are well resourced with the necessary human and material resources. Our main area of focus shall be on technical and vocational education. Our aim is to facilitate the training of people with the necessary skill and practical abilities for national development.

R.P.D government will ensure that every district of the country have at least one well equipped technical and vocational school within the first year of our government. We shall see to the upgrading of the curriculum and facilities in the existing technical schools to facilitate the training of more technical and vocational oriented people.

To encourage more students to pursue courses in these areas of study, R.P.D shall design mechanisms to reduce the cost of vocational and technical education and offer scholarship packages to student who opt for this area.

Generally we shall pursue programs aimed at improving upon the reward packages of teaching and non-teaching staff in all second cycle institutions as a motivation for better results.

Tertiary education

The Reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) shall encourage the training of tertiary institutional graduates, who will appreciate the relevance of the knowledge that they've acquired to national development in order for them to be able to perform creditably in this direction. The R.P.D shall see to the increase in the admission of students into courses deemed more critical to national development in the short term giving much attention to science and technology.

Vocational and technical education will be given the necessary attention in order to produce graduate with practical knowledge and abilities.

Due to this, we will equip all Polytechnics in the country with the necessary facilities and convert them into technical universities where technically oriented diplomas and degrees shall be run. This is will also alleviate the situation where polytechnic products fail to earn the necessary recognition as tertiary graduates, since the Polytechnics were upgraded to tertiary level in 1992. This policy when implemented will also curb the continuous agitations by polytechnic lecturers for being under-paid compared to their colleagues in the universities, thereby reducing their incessant threats of embarking on sit down strikes.

Non-formal Education

We shall institute policies that will enable adult who cannot read nor write acquire this basic knowledge. We shall rejuvenate the defunct functional literacy program all around the country as a way of achieving this.

We shall also put in place mechanisms to forester a closer collaboration between the formal and the non-formal sectors of education especially in the area of technology. We shall encourage our technical universities to work closely with artisan organizations such as SMIDO, KRISTO ASAFO, Ghana Association of Garages and other similar organizations to help build the capacity of our artisans to be abreast with modern technology.

AGRICULTURE

The Reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) shall focus most of its attention on improving agriculture in the country. The R.P.D led Government will make agriculture the backbone of the economy in our

quest to make Ghana the breadbasket of West Africa. We believe in a nation that is able to feed its people and beyond with food produced locally. The R.P.D will do everything possible to change our current agricultural practices which has been dominated by subsistence farming into mechanized farming dominated agricultural sector.

We are of the belief that improving upon the current the agricultural practices in the country can go a long way mitigate if not solve totally, our present economic situation. We shall institute policies aimed at massively improving the quantity of food produced in the country and the management and storage as well as the processing of these produce.

We intend to stem the problem of rural-urban migration through the creation of more agricultural related jobs in the rural area to even encourage the vast number of jobless rural migrants in the cities to go back to their villages to find jobs. We therefore intend converting rural-urban migration to urban-rural migration through agriculture thereby reducing the influx of people and crime in our cities.

Presently around 50% of our arable lands are uncultivated due to:

- a. Lack of fund to cultivate them by their owners
- b. Lack of the required knowledge to effectively put those lands into good use
- c. Increase in the prices of farming inputs.

R.P.D will ensure that within first three years of our government, at least 80% of our arable lands will be cultivated.

To achieve this we shall:

- 1. Revive the co-operative farming scheme.
- 2. Low-interest loans shall be given to these co-operative farmers.
- 3. These farms shall be given free agricultural extension services including technical support and advise.
- 4. Create ready market for their produce by rejuvenating the Ghana Food Distribution Corporation in all regions and districts of the country, which will be well equipped to go to the hinterlands to purchase the produce of farmers upon their request thereby saving them the hustle of carrying their produce to the cities to sell them.
- 5. Build more modern storage facilities all over the country

With this new revolution in the agricultural sector, R.P.D shall minimize the unemployment situation by at least 60%, stem the problem of ruralurban migration, abject poverty and reduce the incidence of social menaces such as robbery, prostitution, illicit drug usage and peddling among other things since the devil finds work for an idle hand and that people will always resort to illegitimate means to make a living if legitimate means of survival are not available.

We firmly believe that by pursuing this noble agricultural agenda we shall solve the nations problems will be brought to the barest minimum.

INDUSTRY

Reformed Patriotic Democrats are committed the industrialization of our economy using agriculture as the catalyst. We intend to achieve this by starting with agro processing factories to process our agricultural produce in order to add value to them.

R.P.D when elected to power shall cite factories in farming communities to process the produce of farms in those communities especially in the northern region of the country to give impetus to our plan to bridge the developmental gap between the north and the south. This will be used as a means of creating additional jobs in these communities to boost our drive to reduce rural–urban migration to the barest minimum. Shares in these factories shall be floated on the stock market as time goes on, to generate capital, which will be invested into other businesses.

This agricultural processing revolution will encourage local and foreign investors to enter into agro-processing and other support ventures.

To boost our industrial drive, the R.P.D shall implement policies aimed at discouraging the importation of food items in the country by setting quota for the importation of these items, which shall be reduced from time-to-time, placing a ban on the importation of foods that are produced in sufficient quantities locally etc. This is to encourage the patronage of "Ghana made foods".

This policy shall be replicated in all other sectors of the economy to ensure that most items used in the country are manufactured locally. This is to:

- a. Increase our G.D.P
- b. Reduce inflation
- c. Strengthen our currency
- d. Build a healthy economy.

The Reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) is committed to building an economy that has its strength based on local resources. Changing our economy from the present commercial status which has made our economy the selling point of goods from Asia and other continents to an industrialized one features prominently on our agenda. We shall do

everything possible to change the fortunes of this nation through industrialization.

JOB CREATION

All the policies outlined so far have a greater tendency of creating jobs for the unemployed in our society. Unemployment, we believe is more associated with the youth than any other category of citizens. We also believe in the fact that the youth are the most energetic in society and if some one is put under frustration in his or her youthful ages as far as lack of jobs are concerned, The likelihood of the person resorting top indiscipline and commitment of crime is very high and this is the reason why our society is engulfed in crime and indiscipline.

To ensure that Ghana benefit from the productive ages of her citizens and also reduce the incidence of crime and indiscipline in our society, the youth who are mostly associated with these vices need to be given jobs to keep them busy in order to make them have little or no time to commit crime.

To this the R.P.D has plans of converting the proceeds of the communications service tax into an employment creation fund, which will be invested into agriculture and industry to provide useful jobs with assured job security to the unemployed in our society. This will go a long way to increase productivity as well as encourage the youth to go into agriculture. We see this as better than the current youth employment program which is more of "finding unsecured jobs for the boys" rather that putting the youth in productive ventures.

R.P.D shall embark on many programs aimed at reducing the present unemployment situation in the country by at least 80% by improving agriculture and industry. In all our policies concerning job creation we shall ensure that the job security of Ghanaians is taken into consideration.

HEALTH

R.P.D sees recently introduced National health insurance scheme as a good policy, which is intended to bring the cost of health services down to, meet the pockets of every Ghanaian. Even though the system in all intends and purposes seem to be a good one, there are a lot of problems associated with it, which if not solved, have the tendency of making it unsustainable or even collapsing it totally. Some of these identified problems among other things are:

a. Delay in the payment of claims to health insurance providers, which has led into a situation where these providers have gotten themselves into serious cash flow problems.

b. Delay in the processing of registration, which sometime takes as much as four months.

R.P.D will review the whole scheme to enable it deliver the kind of services that Ghanaians require. We shall also ensure the swift payment of claims to prevent the service providers from entering into cash flow problems, which could discourage private service providers from continuing working with the scheme.

R.P.D shall review the recently introduced policy of "free baby delivery" which poses a clear and present danger to our economic fortunes since it has the tendency to increase the population and further soaring our budget. It should be noted that 50% of our budget is currently supported by donors, which we need to make frantic efforts to reduce it to the barest minimum. Therefore it would be very imprudent to implement any policy, which would have a negative effect on the economy. We will rather encourage family planning to reduce the population and make baby deliveries free for first timers only.

It is an undisputable fact that the introduction of the national health insurance scheme has increase attendance in our health institutions. This requires the training of more health workers to handle these patients. R.P.D will expand the facilities in all the health-training institutions in the country to enable them increase their student intake to enable us train more health workers for the task ahead. We shall also expand our existing health facilities and build new ones especially in the rural areas, giving much attention to the northern regions of the country.

We shall improve the service conditions of health workers in the country especially those who get posted to rural and deprived communities on the country by applying job evaluation appropriately to set up proper reward packages for them as well as other incentive packages to prevent brain drain.

ROADS & TRANSPORT

The R.P.D is committed to improving the quality of our roads and transport services in the country. The party when voted into power shall ensure that commuting from one place to another in the country takes place in safe, smooth and comfortable atmosphere.

We will ensure that road networks around the country especially, the northern and western parts of the country as well as feeder roads linking our farming communities are put in good shape to boost the proposed agricultural sector improvement program and also fulfill our promise of bridging the developmental gap between the northern and southern parts of the country.

The Reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) shall revamp the collapsing mass transportation system in the country by adding more quality busses to the fleet in order to make road transport services easily assessable and also enable people to commute within our towns and cities comfortably and on time.

We intend to improve this system to encourage citizens to develop the habit of traveling in busses rather in their private vehicle to reduce our fuel consumption and traffic congestion in certain parts of the country.

The private sector will be encouraged to enter into mass transport business by reducing import taxes on vehicles imported into the country for this purpose and also give tax rebate on transport services. R.P.D will also use this avenue to create more secured jobs for drivers and other peripheral transport staff in Ghana. We shall privatize the mass transportation system after some time by floating shares on the stock market to enable individuals acquire shares in the company and also to generate more capital to invest in other critical areas of the economy.

R.P.D is also committed to the improvement of the rail sector to boost our transport system improvement drive. We shall see to the rehabilitation of our existing rail lines as well as constructing new ones to get rail services to all regions in the country. We also intend to modernize rail transport in the country by putting the existing trains into good shape and also acquire new ones for the sector. We shall comb around the world to look for investors to either partner government in this direction or enter into a **Build**, **Operate**, **and Transfer** (B.O.T) contract with an investor whom we deem have the capacity to develop the rail sector.

We shall expand and build an effective transport system for the nation and create more secured jobs in this sector.

HOUSING

When voted to lead the country, R.P.D will ensure that Ghanaians have access to quality and affordable houses. This, we shall achieve through a public-private sector collaboration. We shall provide affordable and quality houses to workers in the country on a hire-purchase basis.

Payment of these properties will be made by monthly installments throughout the working lives of beneficiaries. This is aimed at ensuring that, most Ghanaian workers are housed during their working lives and own houses by the time they go on retirement. This will arrest the situation where, some workers resort to all kinds of dubious means to acquire houses before going on pension thereby aggravating the level of corruption in the country. This will also enable the Ghanaian worker save his rent throughout his/her working life and use it for another purpose. The implementation of this policy shall begin from at most the second year of our leadership.

GOVERNANCE

Selection of Ministers, heads of Departments and Agencies

The reformed Patriotic Democrats (R.P.D) undertake to include all Ghanaian citizens who possesses the required Knowledge, skills and abilities to handle any area of national development in our government without regard to their political, tribal, religious background or any other quality deemed segregating. We aspire to build a nation that thrives mainly on unity of purpose and therefore shall not embark on any action that has the tendency of further polarizing the nation.

We shall also champion the establishment of proportional representation system of governance to enable all political parties have the chance to participate in government.

We shall employ proper 'recruitment and selection' processes in choosing ministers and heads of departments and agencies. This will be opened to all Ghanaians who possess the qualities require for these positions to apply. Selection will be done strictly on merit. During our leadership, holding a party card shall not be a license to occupying any position in the country.

We promise to give this policy all the needed attention because the numerous problems confronting our nation require the 'all hands on deck' approach to solving them and not the 'winner takes all' approach which is mostly characterized by putting square pegs in round whole.

Remunerating, Ministers and Heads of Departments or agencies.

R.P.D has plans aimed at reducing the expenditure on this category of public servants as a way of reducing government expenditure. In line with this, we shall cancel some services that people in this category enjoy freely, such as utilities, fuel etc. and consolidate it into their salaries. Each Minister, Head of Department or Agency shall be allocated one saloon car. We shall create a pool of 4*4 vehicles, which shall be used on

duties outside the capital. The vehicles in this pool shall be well maintained for protocol assignments as well.

These vehicles when needed shall be applied for in a prescribed form after which it will be allocated to the applicant for only the period of the assignment, which it is meant for and fueled according to the distance being traveled. Punitive action shall be taken against any official who fails to comply with this directive.

Our government will be free from extravagance, overspending and wastage. Transparency and accountability will be the hallmark of our administration. We shall make frantic efforts to weed out corruption from the system through whichever means possible. We believe that sanity can only be instilled into our administrative setting, if people in authority are disciplined. Therefore we shall ensure that people in authority during our administration do the right thing at the right time to ensure efficiency.

SUMMARY

R.P.D presents these noble policies as the solution to most of the problems confronting us as a nation. As our elder say in Akan 'asempa ye tia', this document, even though not voluminous, touches on most of the essential sectors of national Development. The areas tackled are the sectors that we shall focus much attention on but not the only areas we pay attention to.

We aspire to unite a polarized nation towards development and we promise to achieve this through forming an all-inclusive government. We shall initiate and if possible conclude moves of drawing one national development policy for the nation in consultation with all political entities, civil society and all other relevant organizations by the end of our first term on office.

We urge you all Ghanaian voters to take a critical look at our manifesto and compare it to that of other parties and choose the best out of them, which we believe is ours, to enable you, make the right choice come December 7^{th} 2008.
